Art work around our school

In our newsletter #9 in June this year we featured an artwork (left) which you can view on the rear wall of Room 20 near the back entrance to our school. This was created by a group of H.I.S girls who chose the story of Maya Angelou famous poet, singer, Memoirist and civil rights activist to represent the stories of many.

This artwork has now been completed and features the words of the title of one of Maya Angelou's most famous poems "Still I Rise". This was written in her third volume of poetry called "And Still I Rise", published in 1978. The message is about the resiliency, strength, and beauty that black communities continue to show through hundreds of years of oppression and discrimination. In a time when racial tensions are at a high, Angelou's poem is still just as relevant as it was in 1978, serving as a reminder to us all that through the collective pain and inequality, still we rise.

There is another wonderful new artwork along Room 28's wall facing the netball courts. A group of our boys Marino R9, Jason R7, Kaydn R11, Elisha R28, Zander R5 and Bronzson R8 created this and it will be featured in our next newsletter.

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Cycle 4 - The focus is 'Technological Products'

Students are settling into their third week of Cycle 4.

The first lessons have been about establishing safe, hygienic routines and developing good time management.

They are currently working on mastering a variety of food preparation techniques and exploring ways to prepare, combine and transform the ingredients into tasty products.










Many recipes promote the use of seasonal fruit and vegetables. The learning experiences are about understanding the nature of the ingredients, how they can be prepared and modified to create a range of products.

Later in the cycle, students will create products of their choice and sometimes their own invention. Ideas created by students in Cycle 3 included tacos, burritos with black beans, samosa, quesadilla, pretzels using a yeast dough, potato top pie including the pastry, and of course sushi...
