The aim of Trees for Survival is to involve our young people in restoring natural habitats by helping landowners revegetate erosion prone land, improve streamflow and water quality and



We dug out about 20 cm of soil so that we could plant our seedlings – **Carex virgata, harakeke, manuka and toetoe**. It was a lot of fun and hard work! We worked up such an appetite, thankfully the landowners had cooked us a delicious lunch! We look forward to doing some more planting again soon!






#### Every day your child is at

school counts. Here is data from 2016 showing the children who achieved the highest in National Standards were those who were at school for 90% of the time or better. ...less than 20 days (4 weeks) away for the year!

#### Good attendance means.....

Being at school at least 95% of the time (184-194) days a year...or no more than two weeks absent across the year.

There are 365 days this year and 194 of these are school days. That leaves 171 days for holidays, shopping, birthday treats and non-urgent medical appointments.



Even coming to school on time matters. Our school begins at 8.50am. We know getting children out of bed, fed and off to school can be a challenge so here are some great places to find ideas to help you.
