FOOD


The focus for 2018 is **Technological Products**. The learning experiences are about understanding the nature of the ingredients, how they can be prepared and modified to create a range of products. They are looking forward to creating ideas of their own.

SCIENCE



In Science, we have been learning about adaptations.

Adaptations are special features that help an animal or plant to survive in its habitat.



Last week, we looked at the adaptations of Emperor penguins and carried out an experiment to see why penguins huddle together to keep warm.

We then used our knowledge of penguin adaptations to discuss ways to prevent water from freezing in a freezer - some ideas were very interesting!!

Kia ora koutou. This term in **Design Tech** we are exploring how we can **sustain** and **celebrate culture** and **identity** through **design**. This ties in with the whole school's inquiry around **Ngā Hau e Whā** - the four winds that bring us all together.



The purpose of this term's design process is for students at HIS to connect with their own cultural heritage through exploring the idea of 'identity' through someone in their family.

They will ask questions to gather information, research cultural symbols, designs and motifs, develop and refine ideas and ultimately produce a 3D work of art that reflects and celebrates the culture and heritage of their stakeholder.

In Design Tech students will learn skills to enable them to confidently use various machines and power tools to construct a box frame that will house their final design.

HOUSE PRIDE @ H.I.S

House pride meetings last Friday were great fun! All students met on the field to develop a **house chant** for their house - **RED**, **BLUE**, **GREEN** or **GOLD**. We then shared the chants and students will use them to cheer on their house at the upcoming athletics day and swimming sports later this term.

Students are awarded house points in classes for anything positive - such as great behaviour or great work. The points are collected each week and the house winner announced every assembly. Train services affected by industrial action

Please be aware that travel to and from schools may be affected over the next 3 weeks due to industrial action.

The Rail and Maritime Transport Union (RMTU) have advised there will be industrial action from Monday 26 February to Friday 16 March. This means that train services on the Eastern, Southern and Western Line will be running at a reduced frequency.

Auckland Transport and Transdev have developed a temporary timetable to minimise disruption and provide consistent rail services on these lines during this period.

Customers can expect Southern, Western and Eastern line weekday peak train services at 20-minute intervals, with inter-peak and off-peak services running as normal.


Many trains on these services will run with six cars, which can hold 900 passengers, to help reduce impact. Onehunga and Pukekohe train services will remain on their usual timetable.
