Kia ora Henderson Intermediate School Whanau

I hope this finds you well.

Last week saw me and both our Deputy Principals attending the Intermediate School **Principals National Conference.** All our Team Leaders also came for a day each. This was a very useful conference for us! I want to share with you some of the key things as they are very useful for you to also know.

One presenter, Nathan Wallis, talked about the actual science of the brain was which very helpful. We were told that at the time when children are at intermediate, the part of the brain that gives them logic, reason and learning ability is in shut down as it is being built towards their adulthood. This is why our students, your children, are very tricky at this stage in their development. They are operating in what is called the Limbic part of their brain. This means all they do is based on what they are feeling and not about thinking. When we, as the adults in their lives, are dealing with them we need to think about this. We need to be patient, give them time to feel safe first, take time to listen to them and then work on teaching them the right way to behave. The minute we get angry they close down and go into a stage where in fact their learning will stop because they will be feeling negative. One of the exciting things too was the reminder that we need to be telling them what to do rather than what not to do. By telling them what we want them to do, they can visualise this and are more likely to learn the right behaviour. Nathan Wallis is also on TV right now with an advertisement and it says at the end, "LOVE GROWS BRAINS".

Another presenter, Michael Fuller was also great. His specialist area is in this intermediate age level. He is an internationally known presenter from Melbourne. Like Nathan he talked about the chemical changes in the brains of children at this stage. The thing that he talks about is that we, as the adults in the lives of our children, need to be able to show children through successful relationships with them: trust, forgiveness, integrity, hope and compassion. Our children need us to show this in all we do. I loved the way that he said that NO LEARNING HAPPENS UNLESS THERE IS A **RELATIONSHIP**. This is a challenging thought for us all. We must make sure that we build a relationship with every child in our class because without that, no learning will take place.

TEACHER ONLY DAY – just a reminder that next **Friday 1**st **June** all 12 schools in our Community Of Learning are having a combined Teacher Only Day. School will be closed that day.

The Value that we are focussing on right now is **PREPARED**. We want our children to be prepared! Getting their uniform out, lunch packed, homework done, being at school by 8.30.....are just a few ways that they need to be prepared.

R2P2 at Henderson Intermediate School

Respectful, Responsible, Prepared and **Proud** are our School Values – these values are encouraged and reinforced to our students as a very important part of their learning here at school. We expect H.I.S students to display these values every day in the classroom, at play, when travelling outside the school and during all school events.









How it works: Each day students have the opportunity to achieve one of these cards by displaying these values. When a student has four cards – one of each value - they are presented with a white R2P2 badge at our Friday assembly. When they have accumulated another eight they gain a silver badge and another sixteen cards gains them a black badge. Badges are then sewn onto the student's red polar fleece and worn with pride.

Chinese Speech Competition

On Saturday, May 12th, three students from **Henderson Intermediate School** competed in the **Chinese Bridge Speech Competition** at the **Confucius Institute** at Auckland University.

The theme was "One World, One Family".

Our students competed in the junior category which was for students Year 7-10 from all around Auckland. The girls worked with **Li Laoshi**, our **Mandarin Learning Assistant**, to write a speech about themselves, where they were from, and about their families. Mandarin speaking Chinese students at our school helped our competitors brush up on their pronunciation and they gave their speech in front of their class or at assembly for practice. All three girls spoke very well at the competition.

Rachel Birch, R10 received a Merit for her speech. Azariah Clarke, R6 placed third and Stephanie Jordan placed second. These results are excellent and we are very proud of these three girls.


Year 7 School Based Immunisation Programme at Henderson Intermediate School.
