Museum Trip

As part of our War and Peace inquiry all Henderson Intermediate students went to visit the Auckland War Memorial Museum. As it was the lead up to the 100th anniversary of Armistice Day, the day World War 1 ended, there were 1000's of named crosses marking the lawn in front of the museum. Each one represented a life lost during the war labelled with that person's birth date and date of death and their service number. It was a powerful display of the 18,000 lives lost.

Inside we explored the Scars on the Heart exhibition. It created lots of interesting and somewhat emotional discussion around war and its consequences. Trying on the uniform was a highlight for many as we explored the timelines of key battles New Zealand fought in. A subtle point for reflection was the pair of glasses from Hiroshima cracked and hazed by the force of the explosion.

We also explored the other exhibitions in the museum...

Students squealed while in the earthquake room. Many budding scientists loved the Discovery Room and used the microscopes to investigate lots of specimens encased in resin.

For many this was a great introduction and we would encourage families to go with their students to investigate areas of interest.




































