STUDENT SUCCESS -This term we also received some fantastic feedback from Mark Shanahan, principal of Waitakere College. Having done testing of Year 8 enrolments, he reported that in the **top 10 students, 7 out of the 10, were from our School**. This is a record achievement and he was hugely excited to share this with us. We were fortunate to send our netball team to AIMS Games this year. Maia Smales, Rm. 5, joined this team as our squash representative.

After a wet and miserably cold start to the tournament, we accumulated seven victories including our first against Te Awamutu (26-9) who finished in fourth place last year and International Sporting Championships Kamo Intermediate (23-7). On Wednesday, the weather improved along with the

importance of each game. From this point on, we could not drop a game. The standard was set with a tough game against Wellington Champions, Maidstone Intermediate from Lower Hutt. After a wobble in our third quarter, we were able to ease out to a 24-16 victory. Completing the group stage with victories against St. Kentigerns (28-5) and Northcote (33-8) set us up for a rematch with Clendon Park, who beat us at Auckland Championships, in the quarter finals. The girls were courageous, decisive and electric. Quick through the court and dominant on defence, we edged out to a 27-19 victory with a game against Cambridge Middle School winning 28-12 to qualify for the final. The final against Whakatane Intermediate was livestreamed which the girls found exciting but also terrifying. The girls began extremely well, especially under pressure to take a 12-8 lead at halftime. With a superb second half, we stretched our lead to 23-13 to claim the AIMS Games most contested title, beating 124 other teams to win Gold.

I haere mai ētahi tauira nō te kura tuatahi o Henderson North, Pomaria, me Rānui ki te mahi ngātahi ki tā mātau taha o Te Whānau Moko.

Anei ngā mahi i oti ai

- Te taha hinengaro: I aro mātou ki tētahi hōtaka pānui, ā, ko te T.T.T (Tatari, Tautoko, Tauawhi), i noho ngātahi ā ngā tuākana, teina me te pānui i ētahi tuhinga.
- Te taha tinana: I aro mātou ki te taha whakapakari tinana me te hauora
- Te taha wairua: E matapaki ana mātou i ngā āhuatanga e hāngai ana ki ā mātou ake tūākiri
- <u>Te taha whānau</u>: I mahi ngātahi, i ako ngātahi mātou mō te katoa o te wānanga

Our focus for pakirehua (inquiry) is Whanaungatanga. One aspect of our pakirehua is to take care of & respect others, we showed that through our understanding of taha hinengaro, tinang, whānau and wairua.

Some students of Henderson North Primary School, Pomaria Primary School and Rānui Primary came to our school to work together with us, te whānau Moko

We focussed on,

- Te taha hinengaro: We concentrated on a Reading Programme called T.T.T (Tatari, Tautoko, Tauawhi), and sat and read together
- Te taha tinana: We worked on physical fitness and health
- Te taha wairua: We discussed the aspects that relate to our identity
- Te taha whānau: For the entire hui we sat and worked together
