In Art, we have been exploring mixed media collage. We have drawn inspiration from the work of New Zealand artists, Margaret Aull and Richard Killeen, incorporating symbols from Aotearoa and the Pacific into our collages.











Students have experimented with various techniques using both wet and dry media to gain different effects. We used a combination of materials to create texture and build up layers in our compositions. Some of the materials we have used in our collages are tissue paper, tinfoil, string, PVA glue, crayon, paint, binder medium and pastel. There is a huge display of these collages exhibited in the corridor outside the hall. Go check it out if you haven't already!

Students have also been collaborating on another installation inspired by Richard Kileen's silhouettes. Students each selected a recognisable symbol from Te Moananui a Kiwa, and using black pen, have designed and drawn intricate patterns over the paint.

There are always many different creative projects that students are working on at Henderson Intermediate, as well as our regular Art programme. We're always experimenting with new ideas in the Art Room and bringing our imagination to life!
