Warmest Greetings to you all!

I hope that your child has settled back into school life. It is so nice to have all our children here together with us again.

Thank you very much for your support with keeping children home when they are unwell. We continue to do all we can here to keep your children safe from Covid19.

It will be lovely to have things like **Netball this term**. We have 15 teams this year! It will be great for children to be able to go out to other sporting events this term too.

Last week we saw the **appointment of 5 Teacher Aides**. Through the Ministry of Social Development, our School has gained 4 Teacher Aides this year. The School only pays a very minimal amount to have them for the year. This is a huge bonus for us. The support of a Teacher Aide is GOLD for our children who need that extra little bit of help!

As a School our number one priority is the safety of your children. We will always do all we can to ensure that they are safe in our care. There will always \Box be times when children may find themselves in a situation where they face conflict. The way that we, as the adults in their lives, respond to this will make a huge difference to them in terms of their safety. Our children need us to help them to learn how they can keep themselves safe. We cannot be beside them every minute, so we must give them the right strategies. Talking with our children about the things they say and do to others, will make a big difference to them being able to stay safe. When your child comes home upset about something, always ask them to think about what they may have said or done that might have led to the conflict they experienced. We do our children no favours if we do not make them think about their actions too. As a School, we will never accept a student physically hurting another one, and we talk with them about how they best respond when another student upsets them in some way. We remind them that physical retaliation is the worst thing they can do, the wrong thing for them to do. As adults, this is the best thing we can teach our children!

The **new classes on the field** are coming on well. These will be ready to occupy by the end of Week 3. The **new roof** on the Caretakers Shed is being installed right now. New **LED lighting** is being put in all rooms. These are far more effective in terms of good light for students to see the work they are doing. The **shade sails** over the inter-challenge, should arrive any day now.



Finally we have been able to get together for Samoan Practice again!






O ai A'u?
