This week we are going to be allowing things to be purchased from the **Canteen**. Children will be able to place their order from their classrooms each morning. These will be delivered to classes at 12pm each day. This means that if children would love a little extra something from the Canteen, they can safely do this. The menu can be found here.

This week we start our **Specialist** programme. This is being done with great care, to ensure that children are safe.

Social Workers in Schools (SWIS) is a free, confidential and voluntary service that is available to families and children in primary and intermediate schools. SWIS have three main roles: 1. One on one work with children and their families/whanau, 2. Provide group programmes which help children and families succeed and 3. Help families to access community support and networks. 
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Desian Technology

Did you know that you can't fold a piece of paper in half more than seven times? For terms 1 and 2 students in Design Technology will be investigating the world of Paper Engineering. Starting out we are exploring various techniques and mechanisms in pop-up books. Students will be creating their own presentation using the skills they acquire. We will have stories literally leaping off the page!

To round our year off, students will explore engineering problem-solving. This looks at a range of tasks and gives students the chance to use their creativity and ingenuity to come up with a solution to the problem. Now have a go try to fold a piece of paper more than seven times and let me know how you went! **Teacher: Mr Oliver Harris**







Students in Sports Technology will be experiencing links to simple biomechanical principles of balance and force, and apply these ideas to their physical activity to improve performance. Students will complete a range of fitness tests on their aerobic (Beep Test), acceleration, coordination, and agility to measure their base fitness. Throughout the year, students will have the opportunity to develop skills in Basketball, Volleyball, Cricket, modified American Football, and Aussie Rules. Teacher: Mr Kieran Paterson

Food Technology will continue to operate in the relocatable room near the field. Throughout the cycle, students will have the opportunity to develop and master a range of food preparation techniques, as they create a variety of products with others. They will learn and practise and understand the importance of safe hygienic procedures. Later in the cycle, students have opportunities to apply their knowledge and create ideas of their own design, working through the Technology Design Process. Students will select from a variety of ingredients, make modifications, experiment with various techniques, combine, cook and create their own products.

All students will complete a questionnaire at the beginning of their cycle, to identify foods they are not able to eat, due to cultural requirements, allergies or other health reasons. If you have any concerns or questions, please contact Mrs Lane. Encourage your child to share their learning experience and help with food preparation at home, so their confidence and enthusiasm continues to grow. Teacher: Mrs Robyn Lane







The Music Classroom is now located on the field of the school and is set up and ready to go. Students this year in Music will focus on listening, reading, playing and creating music. They will explore and listen to different types of musical genres and understand the historical, social, cultural influences that impact and shape music. Students will also learn basic music theory and have the opportunity to compose a range of short compositions to represent and explore different musical influences and genres.



Outside of Music Specialisation students have the opportunity to join the school choir, school band, ukulele group and/or participate in assembly singing. If your child is interested in learning a musical instrument this year, these lessons are on hold for the time being but will resume later in the year. More information will be available in the coming weeks.

WAITAKERE LEARNING SUPPORT (TEACHER AIDE) PROGRAMME

AND

ENVIROSCHOOLS LEARNING SUPPORT AIDE PROGRAMME

26 WEEKS FIXED TERM EMPLOYMENT 20 HOURS PER WEEK

Waitakere Improving School Attendance Programme is continuing our "Return to the Workforce" programmes for parents who currently receive the Sole Parent Support benefit.

We are able to employ 12 Learning Support (Teacher Aides) to work in one of the following schools: Henderson Intermediate; Konini Primary; Liston College; Rangeview Intermediate; Te Atatu Intermediate; and Waitakere SDA School.

We are also able to employ 2 Enviroschools Learning Support Aides, one at Flanshaw Road Primary, and one at Konini Primary.

The 20 hours of work for both programmes is during normal school hours.

The positions are for a **26 week fixed term period** (excluding school holidays) commencing **Monday 14th March 2022.** The projects are partially funded by Work and Income through the Ministry of Development Flexi-Wage Project in the Community. The rate of pay will be \$21.84 per hour (A Grade, Step 1 Teacher Aide Collective Agreement). There is no guarantee that the Learning Support positions or the Enviroschools Learning Support Aide positions will continue after the end of the project.

Successful <u>Learning Support</u> applicants will develop learning support/ teacher aide skills through working with teachers and students in a classroom, supporting literacy, numeracy and general learning needs; and preparing teaching resources and other duties as requested by the school. A job description and training will be provided by each school.

Successful <u>Enviroschools Learning Support Aides</u> will receive training in the Enviroschools kaupapa and related content, including waste, horticulture, gardening and preparing food skills, pests, biodiversity, energy and water conservation through a network of resources as well as from Enviroschools and Auckland Council Sustainable Schools. General Learning Support/Teacher Aide skills will also be developed as an essential part of the role.

PLEASE NOTE: It is <u>mandatory</u> to be double vaccinated against Covid-19 to work in schools and successful applicants will be required to provide proof of vaccinations. Successful applicants must also complete a satisfactory police vet and to be available for interviews during the week Monday 21st – Friday 25th February.
