## From our Principal

#### Kia ora koutou

What a lot of rain we have had so far this term! I hope that all of your homes are okay. It was wonderful how quickly you came and collected your children last week when we had to evacuate due to the heavy rain.

16 of our students from our **Samoan Bilingual Unit** performed at Birdwood School on the 2nd May. This was all about sharing the advantages and positives of being in a Bilingual Unit for learning. Birdwood are looking at starting a Unit like ours. This was a lovely evening for everyone.

We also had a very nice day with our <u>Education Review Office</u> Liaison person. The new way that ERO works is that all schools are allocated a person who stays with that school over a 3 year period. They become very much part of the School in terms of being involved in things at the School.

Last week a selected group of our Māori students began a special **Writers Programme** here at school. This is an exciting programme for these students and what a wonderful thing for us as a School too. At the end of the programme, a book will be published of these students' work.

Over the next 2 weeks we will be getting **new roofing** over the library, staffroom and Rooms 1 and 2. This is long awaited and with all this rain we really need to get on top of any areas where the

roofing is not holding well.

The Ministry of Education is providing funding to schools to provide an after school **learning support programme** and we are in the process of getting this up and running. The project is called "Lost Learning" and it is for children who have, through Covid, been impacted in terms of achievement and learning progress. This is a fantastic initiative from the Ministry. A letter will come home seeking your approval for your child to be part of this. Not all teachers are involved, just the ones who wish to as this is after school. We also have some Teacher Aides who will also work with teachers. I am excited about this as I believe we will see real progress for students!


