REPORT TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

MID YEAR REVIEW OF THE 2023 ANNUAL PLAN

This provides a brief summary of progress to date, working towards achieving all we set out in our 2023 Annual Plan.

All classes are working to remove the language of streaming. Staff talk about how they workshop with students who have a particular learning need. This is a big shift and will take time for us to fully embed across the school. Teachers talk about the way that they are using strength based approach through using more able students with less able ones.

Teacher timetables are confirming that we are providing good time for students in the learning of Reading, Spelling, Writing and Maths. Absolute priority is being given to the "three RS." Through the Ministry providing the Lost Learning Programme Funding, we now have a large group of students who are receiving extra tutoring after school in these 3 key areas. I am excited about what the data will show at the end of Term 4, for these students. A ratio of one teacher to 5 students has got to be good!

Parents met at the start of the year with their child's teacher and again in the last week of the term they will meet parents. Parents will come to school to get their child's mid year written report and will discuss it with the teacher. The School is growing that triadic relationship between home, school and student.

The after school Pasifika group has grown in numbers and this is a real area of strength in the School.

It is great to see the Kapa Haka underway and showing strength moving forward. We are delighted to have Hone Tobin back with us to lead this.

The Pasifika Celebrations Evening in Term 1 went very well. The format of the meeting changed slightly and this was a resounding success. Again the hall was packed!

Staff are all part of things Pasifika here. We are very much led by our Pasifika Staff. The National Languages Weeks are always celebrated in style!

The School production is in full swing. This gives many of our students an opportunity to shine in the area of the performing arts.

The after school netball is well underway and we again have a huge number of teams that are involved. Students have taken part in many different sporting codes over the last 2 terms. Exciting to see the variety of different sports, things like Orienteering and Petanque as well.

Staff enjoyed the trip to Waitangi last weekend. This was wonderful new learning for many of them. This time was also used for the Board Residing Member to gather feedback from all staff about what they see as critical skills and qualities in the new Principal.

Through our Property Manager, the grounds and buildings are well maintained. The School was recently visited and assessed by the MOE on the condition of our buildings and grounds. We got a glowing report back. This term has seen us with a new carpark and also the shade sale cover over the Rooms 7 - 11 block. Both these things are wonderful for us.

Staff are provided with a lot of PLD and any staff member who finds something that they feel would benefit them, they know the Board will cover the cost of it. Again this year the Board has very generously funded scholarships for staff who have wanted to do university work which is costly. This is hugely appreciated by staff. Teacher Aides have also been able to tap into PLD provided by various agencies. Through the Reo Moana Project, many of our Pacific Staff have had good PLD too and this continues this year. Through our WSL we also have been able to access good support for classroom teachers around Maths, Reading, Spelling and Writing.

The Whānau Hui in Term 1 was a wonderful success. There was a very good turnout of whānau. Since this, Matua Mark Snowden has started running evening classes with Maori Whānau on Tikanga and also te reo Māori. These evenings are well attended which is exciting! This was a request from whānau to the school, to provide for them.

Moko Team has a new look to it with now 3 teachers in the 2 classes. 2 of these are Untrained teachers who are fluent speakers and have been Teacher Aides in our School this year. Kōkā Ernestine is leading Moko Team now. This is going very well.

In homeroom classes, all students are expected to use everyday Māori words and phrases.

In the second half of this year, businesses will be coming into school to share about their jobs/careers. We will be using the people involved in our new build. A competition for design of the gardens has been introduced and the architect for the project will come to assembly and judge the designs. This will be great! Anything like this that involves new learning for our students, is fantastic

Our staff, teachers and teacher aides, set high expectations for all students. Planning is high quality and everyone knows that this is the expectation before we can work alongside any students.

Early in Term 2 we got underway with our ERO partnership, with Anjie Savage. This is going to be a very positive partnership for the School. We now have planned visits with her throughout the year.
