Earlier this year in Room 2 we had learnt about biographies, timelines, what a nero is and now to use figurative language and a writing process. We also held Athletics day and a house colour/cultural wear day as a fundraiser for the flooding in Hawkes Bay. One of the main people we wrote about in our biographies was Dame Whina Cooper who was a Māori activist that stood for equal rights. Soon after that we made a timeline which documented the important things she had achieved in her life. Later on we learnt about heroes and what heroes are. For example Doctors.
